Fairfax County, Board of Supervisors, Providence District - ONLY Requirements for the November 5, 2019 General Election

Filing re-opened due to the death of the Republican Party's nominee.

Definitions and Key Icons

Political party – an organization that, at either of the two preceding statewide general elections, received at least 10 percent of the total vote cast for any statewide office filled in that election (currently only Democratic and Republican)

Non-primary party candidate – an individual who is seeking the nomination of a political party by a means other than a primary; speak with the party

Independent – an individual who is seeking to run in a General Election without the nomination from the Republican or Democratic party (may include a recognized party or no party)

Incumbent – an officeholder who wants to run for reelection to the same office

Qualified voter – a person who is entitled to vote under the Virginia Constitution and is properly registered to vote (*see* <u>definition here</u>)

Va. Code – Virginia Code

VAC - Virginia Administrative Code

COMET – Database for candidates to file, and the Department of Elections to track, campaign finance

How candidates get on the ballot in Virginia

Follow these instructions if you are running as an Independent or Republican candidate for Board of Supervisors, Providence District in Fairfax County.

Follow these instructions to get on the ballot for the General Election on Tuesday, November 5, 2019.

Do you fulfill the basic qualifications to be a candidate?				
	You have been a resident of Virginia for one year immediately preceding the election.			
	You are a resident of Fairfax County's Providence Magisterial District.			
	You are registered to vote in Fairfax County's Providence Magisterial District.			

Special Note

The Virginia Code grants ballot access to the political party losing its nominee due to death through Friday, October 11, 2019 (§§ 24.2-539, 24.2-540, and 24.2-541). The Code also grants ballot access to independent candidates through Friday, October 11, 2019. Section 24.2-612 of the Code of Virginia establishes that absentee voting for the November 2019 election must begin on Friday, September 20, 2019. For those individuals who choose to participate in ballot access in this case, please be mindful of the Code's requirement to re-print and re-send absentee ballots when new candidates are added to the ballot after the commencement of absentee voting. Therefore, please keep the election officials of Fairfax County and the citizens of Providence Magisterial District within Fairfax County in mind when considering being involved in this re-opened ballot access period and make every effort to file with the Fairfax County General Registrar's office as early as possible.

Follow these steps to file your candidacy:

Fill out and submit the <u>Certificate of Candidate Qualification Form – Local Offices</u> (SBE-501).



Find in Virginia Code §§ 24.2-501 or 24.2-503.



Non-primary party and independent candidates

File starting August 12, 2019.

File ending October 11, 2019 at 4:30 pm (see *Special Note* on page 4).

All candidates can mail this form by the deadline and the general registrar will accept it. You must:

- Pay the postage and send by registered or certified mail.
- Keep the receipt in case the general registrar asks for proof that you mailed this form before the deadline.



Submit this form to your general registrar.



After you submit this form:

- The general registrar puts your information into the Virginia Election and Registration Information System (VERIS).
- The Department of Elections posts your contact information on the Department website.
- Fill out and submit the <u>Statement of Economic Interests</u> (if required).



Find in Virginia Code §§ 24.2-502 and 24.2-503.

Required of a candidate running for constitutional office OR a candidate running for a seat on a governing body or elected school board of any county, city, or town with a population in excess of 3,500 persons.

Non-primary party and independent candidates

File starting August 12, 2019.

File ending October 11, 2019 at 4:30 pm (see *Special Note* on page 4).

All candidates can mail this form by the deadline and we will accept it. You must:

- Pay the postage and send by registered or certified mail.
- Keep the receipt in case we ask for proof that you mailed this form before the deadline.
- Submit this form to your general registrar.
- Filing with your general registrar does not apply to incumbents seeking the same office who filed the Statement of Economic Interest pursuant to § 2.2-3117, as part of their requirements of being an office holder.


File starting August 12, 2019.

File ending October 11, 2019 at 4:30 pm (see *Special Note* on page 4).

Your general registrar must **receive** this form by the deadline listed above. A postmark or other mailing service timestamp does not qualify.

- Submit this form along with the Petitions of Qualified Voters to your general registrar.
 - If you are a party candidate nominated by a method other than a primary, then you do not need to submit a Declaration of Candidacy or Petition of Qualified Voter forms unless required by your party.
- □ Collect petition signatures and submit the <u>Petitions of Qualified Voters</u> (SBE-506/521).
 - Find in Virginia Code §§ <u>24.2-505(D)</u>, <u>24.2-506</u>, <u>24.2-507</u>, <u>24.2-521</u>, and <u>24.2-522</u>. Find in 1 VAC 20-50-20 and 1 VAC 20-50-30.

Candidates running for the general election may file petition pages more than once.

A candidate needs 125 registered voter signatures. The signatures must be from registered voters within Providence Magisterial District.

Independent candidates will appear on the ballot in the order of time of filing for the office - the time at which the independent candidate files the required number of petition signatures. If no petition is required, the time of filing will be when the candidate files a completed statement of qualification.

At the time of filing you can request notification of any problems that can be corrected before the filing deadline. Make this request in writing and address it to the Secretary of the local electoral board.

They will try to get back to you but cannot guarantee a timely response.

If you do not qualify as a candidate because you did not have enough signatures then you can submit an appeal to the local electoral board regarding the petition signatures.

Submit your appeal within 5 days from when the disqualification notice was issued (see *Special Note* on page 4).

You will need to prove that you have the correct number of signatures from qualified voters before the deadline.

The next two requirements relate to Campaign Finance accounts and reporting.

Fill out and submit <u>Statement of Organization for a Candidate.</u>

Find in Virginia Code Title 24.2 Chapter 9.3.

Within 10 days of one of the following:

- you accept a contribution.
- you spend any funds.
- you pay a filing fee.
- you file a Certificate of Candidate Qualification.
- you appoint a campaign treasurer, campaign committee, or campaign depository.
- Submit copies to:
 - With the Department of Elections according to the instructions in COMET
 - the General Registrar in the locality where you live after filing with the Department of Elections.
- If you do not submit this form you may have to pay penalties.
