How candidates get on the ballot in VA

Follow these instructions to get on the ballot for House of Delegates and Senate of Virginia in:

- the Primary Election on Tuesday June 11, 2019.
- the General Election on Tuesday November 5, 2019.

Definitions and Key Icons

Political party – An organization that, at either of the two preceding statewide general elections, received at least 10 percent of the total vote cast for any statewide office filled in that election

Primary candidate – an individual who is seeking the nomination of a political party by running in a primary

Non-primary party candidate – an individual who is seeking the nomination of a political party by a means other than a primary

Independent – an individual who is seeking to run in a General Election without running as a Republican or Democrat (may include a recognized party or no party)

Incumbent – An officeholder who wants to run for reelection to the same office

Qualified voter – A person who is entitled to vote under the Virginia Constitution and is properly registered to vote (*see* <u>definition here</u>)

Va. Code – Virginia Code

COMET – Electronic campaign finance filing system offered by the Department of Elections

Non-primary party and independent candidates

File starting January 2nd, 2019. File ending June 11th, 2019 at 7 pm.

All candidates can mail this form by the deadline and we will accept it.

You must:

- Pay the postage and send by registered or certified mail.
- Keep the receipt in case we ask for proof that you mailed this form before the deadline.



Submit this form to the Department of Elections.



After you submit this form:

- The Department of Elections puts your information into the Virginia Election and Registration Information System (VERIS).
- The Department of Elections posts your contact information on the Department website.

- Pay the postage and send by registered or certified mail.
- Keep the receipt in case we ask for proof that you mailed this form before the deadline.
- Submit this form to the Department of Elections.
 - Filing with Department of Elections does not apply to incumbents seeking the same office who filed the Statement of Economic Interest pursuant to §30.310, as part of their requirements in being a member of the General Assembly.

Submit payment starting January 2nd, 2019.
Submit payment before March 28th, 2019 at 5 pm.

Submit Primary Filing Fee Receipt, Declaration of Candidacy form, and petition signatures together.

Non-primary party and independent candidates do not need to pay filing fee.



Submit your payment to the Treasurer or Director of Finance in the locality where you live.



Keep the receipt for your payment. You will need to submit this with your Declaration of Candidacy and petition signatures.

For candidates for General Assembly, you will pay 2% of the minimum annual salary for the office.

Senate salary = \$18,000.00 Filing fee = \$360.00House salary = \$17,640.00 Filing fee = \$352.80

Candidates nominated by a political party by a method other than a primary election may need to file a fee. Contact your party's district chair for details.

What happens to my primary filing fee if I get disqualified, run unopposed, or withdraw?

If you get disqualified or run unopposed you will get a refund for the primary filing fee.

If you withdraw you can get a refund if the Department of Elections receives your withdrawal notice before the party chair files the Certification of Qualified Primary Candidates form. The deadline for party chairs to file is April 2nd, 2019, but they may file sooner.

Independent candidates

File starting January 2nd, 2019. File ending June 11th, 2019 at 7 pm.

We must **receive** this form by the deadline listed above. A postmark or other mailing service timestamp does not qualify.



Submit this form along with:

- the Petitions of Qualified Voters AND
- the Primary filing receipt (if required)

- Primary candidates: District Party Chair
- All other candidates: Department of Elections.
- If you are a party candidate nominated by a method other than a primary then you do not need to submit a Declaration of Candidacy unless required by your party.
- ☐ Collect petition signatures and submit the <u>Petitions of Qualified</u> <u>Voters</u> (SBE-506/521).
 - Find in Virginia Code §§ <u>24.2-505(D)</u>, <u>24.2-506</u>, <u>24.2-507</u>, <u>24.2-521</u>, and <u>24.2-522</u>.

Candidates running for general or special elections may file petition pages more than once. File the Declaration of Candidacy the first time you file petition pages.

See table below for number of signatures needed.

At the time of filing you can request notification of any problems that can be corrected before the filing deadline. Make this request in writing and address it to the Secretary of the State Board of Elections.

We will try to get back to you, but cannot guarantee a timely response.

If the State Board of Elections says that you do not have enough signatures then you can submit an appeal to the State Board.

Submit your appeal **within 5 days** from when the disqualification notice was issued.

You will need to prove that you have the correct number of signatures from qualified voters before the deadline.

Within 10 days of one of the following:

- you accept a contribution.
- you spend any funds.
- you pay a filing fee.
- you file a Certificate of Candidate Qualification.
- you appoint a campaign treasurer, campaign committee, or campaign depository.



Submit copies to:

- With the Department of Elections according to the instructions in COMET
- the General Registrar in the locality where you live after filing with the Department of Elections.

If you do not submit this form you may have to pay penalties.

This does not disqualify you.
